Amnesty International:

Amnesty International formed a chapter at UNLV the Fall semester of 1990. Amnesty works for the release of prisoners of conscience; men, women and children imprisoned for their beliefs, color, sex, ethnic origin, language or religion, provided they have neither used nor advocated violence; fair and prompt trials for all political prisoners, and an end to torture and executions in all cases,

The Las Vegas area groups are working hard for the release of Wei Jingsheng, a Chinese dissident imprisoned since 1979. His crime was writing an article calling for democracy in China during Mao's period of economic reforms in the late seventies. The other major focus of the UNLV group last semester was human rights legislation in the United States.

During the last Congressional session the UNLV group lobbied for passage of several human rights bills, including The Convention Against Torture. Senators Reid and Bryan both voted for passage of The Convention, which passed easily due to pressure from Amnesty International groups throughout the country.
