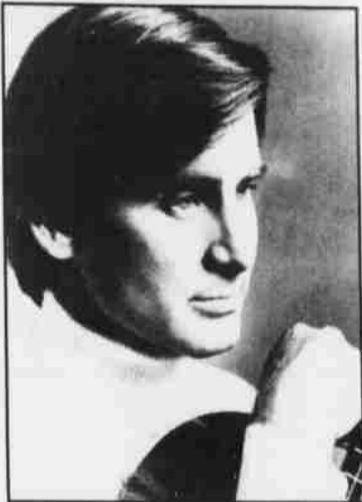


St. Martin-in-the-Fields to perform at UNLV

The Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields, considered by many to be the most-recorded classical group in the world, will perform at Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall on Feb. 15. It is the latest in the Charles Vanda Master Series; the series is sponsored in part by radio station KNPR-FM.

Performing with the orchestra will be guitarist Christopher Parkening, who has performed for the Grammy Awards and on several other television shows.

The orchestra Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields is featured on more than 400 records. The evening's performance will include "Simple Symphony, Op. 4" by Britten, "Chamber Symphony, Op. 110a" by Shostakovich, and

The fully staged production is under the musical direction of Dr. Douglas R. Peterson, with stage direction by

Admission is \$10 for adults and \$7 for persons over 55, students, military and the handicapped. The Las Vegas Music and Dance Ensemble, Nevada's only multimedia professional ensemble, will assemble the finest cast from the worlds of music, dance, theatre, art and poetry for its concert Sat., Feb. 16 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, Feb. 17 at 2 p.m. in the Judy Bayley Theatre.

The first half of the concert will open with "House of Rae," an upbeat modern jazz work choreographed by Carole Rae, about the dance craze "voguing" with electronic type by Beth Mehocic. "Conflict '91," composed by Mehocic, is a music drama about the Persian Gulf for mixed quintet, featuring trumpeter Walter

Blanton.

The next work, "Perception," is choreographed by Victoria Dale with another score by Mehocic, based on the poem "Without You," by local poet/actor Rodney J. Lee, who will be featured in this mystical dance drama with dancers Natalie Fredericks and Michael Balaniere.

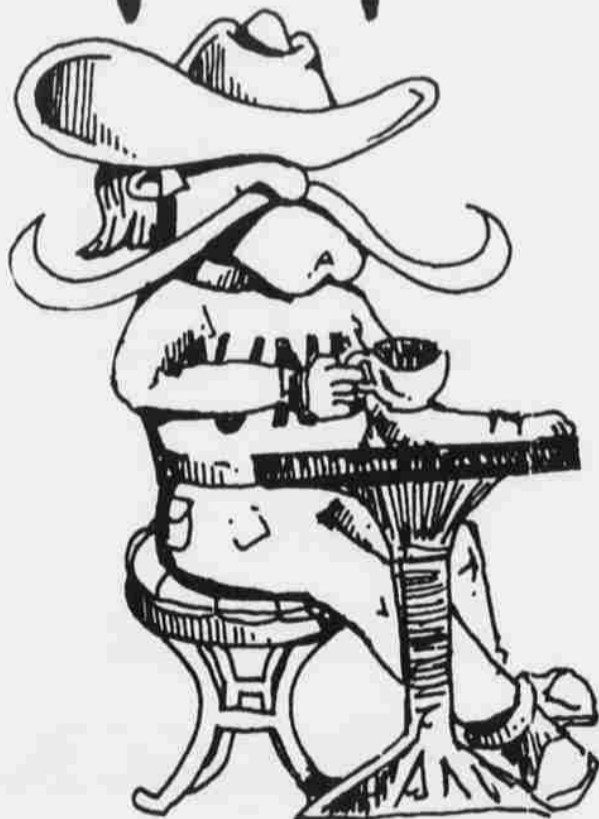
The second half of the concert opens with a special premiere of "Lament" by famed jazz composer Jack Montrose, based on a poem by Dylan Thomas. The next work, "Sonic Landscapes," composed by Mark Philips, comes alive with choreography by Cathy Allen and a visual art performance by Denise

Shapir, gallery manager for the Clark County Library District. The work features oboist Stephan Caplan and electronic tape.

The finale is "Blues in the Ozone," composed by Blanton, a new work for small jazz ensemble that is based on stream-of-consciousness mood changes that were experienced while the composer was stranded on an airplane waiting for takeoff.
