TUTORS EARN \$5.10 AN HOUR TO START. STUDENTS PAY ONLY \$3.00 PER HOUR. \*\*(a \$6.00 deposit is required to sign a student up and is refundable if the student shows up for all sessions or cancels within the time required)

### HOW IT WORKS

TUTORS AND STUDENTS FILL OUT A SCHEDULE OF TIMES WHEN THEY ARE AVAILABLE AND THE STUDENT DEVELOPMENT CENTER MATCHES TIMES BETWEEN THE TUTOR AND STUDENT. TUTORS AND STUDENTS THEN USUALLY MEET ONCE OR TWICE A WEEK THROUGHOUT THE SEMESTER.
