New 'School of Social Work' at UNLV

At the Feb. 15 meeting, the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada System approved "school" status for the Department of Social Work at UNLV. This represents the culmination of an effort on the part of the faculty and administration to expand the social work programs and give them greater viability and visibility.

The change in designation from "department" to "school" will positively impact the hiring of new faculty; the attraction of federal, state and private training funds; the recruitment of potential students; and job placement possibilities of social work graduates. In addition, graduates will have easier access to Ph.D. programs in comparable professional schools across the country.

The new School of Social Work has 225 undergraduate majors and 40 graduate students. It is the first in Nevada and one of only three schools at UNLV, joining the Greenspun School of Communications and the School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

Lecture series at Lake Mead

The National Park Service is hosting its Guest Lecture Series in March. Southern Nevada history will be the focus on March 1, as Frank Wright, Curator of Educa-

tion at the Nevada State Museum and Historical Society presents "Pioneering of Southern Nevada." Wright will introduce pre-Las Vegas history and early settlers' survival in the harsh desert environment.

On March 15, "Celebration of our 75th" will be presented by Virginia and George Forbes, volunteers for the National Park Service throughout the years. The presentation marks the 75th anniversary of the National Park Service.

On March 22, Russell Grater, the original naturalist at Lake Mead, will help identify flowers in the Lake Mead area and give clues where they'll bloom this spring.

The 45-minute programs will be held Fridays at 7:30 p.m. at the Alan Bible Visitor Center, located four miles east of Boulder City at the intersection of U.S. Highway 93 and Nevada Highway 166. The programs are free and open to the public.

Free tax assistance



The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs open free assistance sites in February every year. VITA is an IRS program and TCE is jointly sponsored by the IRS and the American Association of Retired Persons. All volunteers are trained in the preparation of basic 1040 family tax returns.

People coming for help should bring a copy of last year's return, all W-2s, and any documents needed to support claims for credit or deduction.

IRS walk-in counter service is available from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday in the Las Vegas office at 4750 W. Oakey

Blvd. Tax forms are available in these offices, many libraries, and some banks.

Senior citizens tax/rent assistance
The Assessor's office is now

accepting applications for the senior citizens tax/rent assistance program. To qualify, you must be 62, a six-month resident, own or rent property in Clark County (including a mobile home or lot) and have a total household income of less than \$15,100.

Seniors must supply copies of their social security 1099 form, and a copy of their IRS return (if they file). Renters must supply copies of their rent receipts for 1990.

Kappa Sigma Fraternity holds leadership conference

Over the weekend of March 1-3, the local chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity will be hosting the fraternity's leadership conclave for the Western United States. This event, held every spring, was held last year at San Diego State University.

Typically, the conferences deal with fund-raising, pledge programs and rush, but according to Carlos Silva, president of Kappa Sigma's UNLV chapter, this year it will be more of "a personal kind of growth" and will emphasize alumni, public relations and scholarship programs.

Among those attending from Kappa Sigma headquarters will be Lloyd Zickert, president, and Michael Tavilan, scholarship chair, who will discuss scholarship in the '90s and its programs. Bill Paulos, general manager of the Excalibur Hotel and Casino, who was one of the first members of Kappa Sigma's UNLV chapter, will be speaking on Friday, March 1.

The conclave is not for Kappa Sigma members only. Two programs will be open to the entire UNLV community. On March 2, from 1:30 to 3 p.m., Claude W. Olney, seminar leader of "Where There's a Will, There's an A" will be speaking at the Moyer Student Union. Silva said that by opening this event "UNLV students will benefit, as well as Kappa Sigma." He added, "Kappa Sigma has received a lot of support from

the university — from the administration all the way down to the entire student body."

Immediately following Olney's seminar will be a seminar by John Furze, a member of Kappa Sigma at Southern Methodist University, who was featured in the Dec. 15, 1990 issue of *People* magazine and appeared on CNN's "Sonya Live." Furze's seminar, which is sponsored by the MSU Program Council, will discuss date rape, titled "Rape: a Different Perspective."

Furze, who promotes rape awareness at SMU, said that many men at universities may commit (date) rape and not even realize it. He explained that men must be aware of what rape is.

"It's an uphill battle. I sometimes compare the subject of rape with a game of dodgeball in which we've lined women up on one side of a room and taught them how to dodge the ball, or how to avoid rape. What we should be doing is lining guys up on the other side of the room and teaching them not to throw the ball in the first place," Furze said.

Ramon Rodriguez, of the UNLV Student Health Center, will also speak on the subject.
