Immediately following Olney's seminar will be a seminar by John Furze, a member of Kappa Sigma at Southern Methodist University, who was featured in the Dec. 15, 1990 issue of People magazine and appeared on CNN's "Sonya Live." Furze's seminar, which is sponsored by the MSU Program Council, will discuss date rape, titled "Rape: a Different Perspective.

Furze, who promotes rape awareness at SMU, said that many men at universities may commit (date) rape and not even realizeit. He explained that men must be aware of what rape is.

"It's an uphill battle. I sometimes compare the subject of rape with a game of dodgeball in which we've lined women up on one side of a room and taught them how to dodge the ball, or how to avoid rape. What we should be doing is lining guys up on the other side of the room and teaching them not to throw the ball in the first place," Furze said.

Ramon Rodriquez, of the UNLV Student Health Center, will also speak on the subject.
