It's the time of the year when KUNV Community Radio Station presents its annual fundraiser, "Marathon '91." This is the one week of the year when the radio station takes time out on the air to ask for contributions from students and members of the Las Vegas community.

The funds raised this year are to be used to keep the station in working order on the air, and to also pay for transmitters and other vital equipment to the operation of the station.

Last year there was \$18,500 pledged and this year KUNV's

General Manager Rob Rosenthal said he hopes that they'll raise approximately \$25,000.

"Listeners are an important element of the station's funding scheme. We encourage anyone—including staff, faculty, students and members of the Las Vegas community—to join in and help us by pledging their donation," Rosenthal said.

Marathon '91 will begin March 3 at 6 p.m. and run 24 hours a day until March 10 at 6 p.m. KUNV will continue to have regular programming but will spend more time on the microphone to ask for pledges.

This is the 10th anniversary

at KUNV. Their slogan this year is "Ten years in your ears."

In return for the pledges given by students and others, they will receive prizes for donations. Listeners can choose "premiums" ranging from records, CDs, dinners and T-shirts.

"We encourage everyone to tune in and give us a call, even if they are not avid listeners," Rosenthal said.

Tune in for the pledge telephone number and the KUNV staff and volunteers from UNLV will answer phones and take pledge donations.

# Photo controversy

A photo that ran in Thursday's edition of *The Yellin' Rebel* has stirred controversy between the American Society of Civil Engineers Student Chapter and candidates seeking election to the Student Government Executive Board.

In Thursday's issue, a photo was printed of junior high and high school students holding bridges they made during a recent contest held at UNLV. In the photo was Chris Robertson, candidate for student body president, Leo Poggione, candidate for Senate President, and Christian Hardigree, candidate for student body vice president.

On Thursday evening, Randall Thomas, senior and bridge contest chair, went to *The Yellin' Rebel* office where he informed the editors that these political candidates had nothing to do with the bridge-building contest.

"This contest was entirely organized, funded and directed by members of our parent chapter, with help from many of the students of the Howard R. Hughes College of Engineering and myself," Thomas said. "I am highly resentful that these political candidates are attempting to give the impression that they were in some way involved with our event in order that they may get their picture in the paper."

Soon after, another letter was delivered to *The Yellin' Rebel*. Louis Huff, MEG major, told the newspaper that he was working the Saturday when the bridge-building contest was being held.

"When were these candidates there?" he asked. "They didn't even help us. I was there from the beginning to the end and then they showed up in the picture."

*The Yellin' Rebel* had printed a notice concerning the upcoming contest and week of activities in the Feb. 14 issue. Because of serious cutbacks due to Student Government policies, a photographer

and/or reporter was not able to cover the actual event.

"Chris Robertson called me," said Editor Bonar Tucker. "He told me he and Christian had been helping at this event and that they had pictures. He asked if I was interested in printing them."

Tucker said she told Robertson she was very interested in them because of the shortage of reporters and photographers.

"Since it has been so difficult to get people paid to work here, we are down to a skeleton crew. Since Robertson told me he and Hardigree had helped there, I thought it would be the only way we could get a photo in the paper about it," she said.

Tucker said when she learned that Hardigree and Robertson were not a part of the event she contacted them at once.

"I asked why he (Robertson) told me he had helped if he had not done so," Tucker said. "He said he did help by getting the picture in the paper for the kids."

Thomas said no one who worked the day of the contest and no one who was involved with the project had even seen Robertson, Hardigree or Poggione.

Thomas said, "The day the photo came out, four people said to me, 'Who are these people?'"

"It looks like they're trying to steal our credit for our hard work," he said.

Hardigree, however, said, "We saw things happening at the engineering building and we went in and spent 1/2 hour with the kids. We decided to take a picture. We were going to get out of the picture but some of the kids asked us to stay."

Hardigree said she apologized for not giving the Engineering Department the credit they deserve.

"I'd like to get this cleared up," she said.

"Politically, it was good for us to be there," she said, "but we were there."

## PROCEDURE FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENT TICKETS FOR THE 1991 MEN'S NCAA BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

### WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE TICKETS?

All currently enrolled UNLV students are eligible. A student ID with a Spring 1991 validation sticker is required for lottery sign up.

### WHERE DO I SIGN UP AND HOW WILL THE TICKETS BE ALLOCATED?

A sign up table will be set up on the first floor of Moyer Student Union beginning Monday, March 4 at 11:00 AM until 5:00 PM; on Tuesday, March 5 at 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM; and Wednesday, March 6 from 9:00 AM until 3:00 PM. There will be 3 separate lotteries for each tournament level—the Subregionals (1st and 2nd Rounds), the Regional, and the Final Four. Students may enter 1, 2, or all 3 lotteries. Two students may enter their names together in each lottery, but they may only enter 1 time for each tournament round. The lotteries will all be conducted on Wednesday, March 6 at 5:00 PM in Moyer Student Union. Seating assignments for each tournament site will be in priority order according to the lottery drawing. A listing of students whose names were drawn will be listed in priority order and posted outside the CSUN offices by 10 AM, Thursday, March 7. A percentage of alternates over and above the number of tickets allocated for each tournament round will also be drawn. The names of the alternates for each of the 3 lotteries will also be shown on the official list posted outside the CSUN offices on March 7.

### TOURNAMENT SITES, GAME DATES AND TICKET ALLOCATIONS

The Subregional games will be held at either Salt Lake City, March 14-16 or Tucson, March 15-17; 14 tickets have been allocated to students. The Regional will be held in Seattle on March 21-23; 118 tickets have been allocated to students. The Final Four will be held in Indianapolis, March 30-April 3; 382 tickets have been allocated to students.

### TICKET PAYMENT METHOD, DEADLINES, AND PRICES

Ticket payment will be at the Thomas and Mack Ticket Office. Students who were selected by lottery will need to present a valid student ID card at the Ticket Office. Payment must be made by cash, by a local check drawn against a local bank along with picture ID and a bank check cashing card, or by Visa or Master Card. Upon receipt of payment, the box office will issue a voucher to allow for the ticket to be picked up at the tournament site. A validated student ID card and voucher will be required to obtain the ticket at the specified distribution site. For the Subregionals (1st and 2nd Rounds) the ticket prices are: \$52.00 if UNLV plays in Salt Lake City; or \$54.00 if UNLV plays in Tucson. Payment for Subregional tickets is due by March 12 at 5:00 PM. Any student who does not pay by the deadline forfeits claim to the ticket; students on the Subregional alternate list may purchase unclaimed student tickets by making payment between 5 PM and 6 PM on March 12.

### PROCEDURE FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENT TICKETS FOR THE 1991 MEN'S NCAA BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

TICKET PAYMENT METHOD, DEADLINES, AND PRICES (CONT.) The price for the Regional tickets is \$46.00. Payment for the Regional round tickets is due by Tuesday, March 19, 5 PM. Students who do not pay by the deadline forfeit claim to the ticket; students on the Regional alternate list may purchase unclaimed student tickets by making payment between 5 PM and 6 PM on March 19. The ticket price for the Final Four is \$60.00. Payment for the Final Four tickets is due by Wednesday, March 27, 5 PM. Students who do not pay by the deadline forfeit claim to the ticket; students on the Final Four alternate list may purchase unclaimed student tickets by making payment between 5 PM and 6 PM on March 27.
