*UNLV physics open house*



UNLV Society of Physics Students (SPS) held a physics and astronomy open house Saturday, Feb. 23 for local high school students. The open house was sponsored jointly by SPS, UNLV Physics Department and Student Government.

The welcoming session included a demonstration by SPS member John Hagen of how the properties of material change when subjected to cryogenic temperatures. Dr. Stanley Cloud, SPS faculty advisor, discussed resonance.

The physics research laboratories of Professors John Farley, James Selser and David Shelton were visited by Open House attendants. Professors Diane Smith, Lon Spight and Donna Weistrop presented astronomy demonstrations and discussions.

SPS members Martin Daly and Mark Morningstar helped the high school students measure the speed of light with a "hands-on" demonstration experiment.

The open house had several objectives, according to Bruce Rugar, president of SPS.

"We wanted high school students to see the type of work physicists and astronomers do. We also wanted them to see the educational opportunities here at UNLV. The efforts of more than a dozen SPS members contributed to the success of the open house," he said.

The program is called Peacework and offers exciting opportunity for travel and service in a unique multi-cultural environment.

Undergraduates, graduate students and recent college graduates are encouraged to apply. Selection is competitive and based on enthusiasm for service, academic studies and experiences in international travel and volunteer programs. Foreign language skills are also considered. No construc-

tion experience or skill is required. It costs \$600 to \$900 plus airfare. Programs are offered in cooperation with local relief organizations and with habitat for Humanity International. The program will be held from July 24 - Aug. 18.
