Perfect 27-0 Rebels finish regular season with win over Titans by Richard Munson

The Runnin' Rebels have completed step one of the 1990-91 campaign. They have made it through the regular season undefeated. Step two is winning the Big West Conference Championship. And step three is winning the NCAA tournament. If the Rebels are going to do this they must win nine more games for their second consecutive National Championship.

On Saturday the Rebels ended the regular season with a 104-83 victory over Cal State Fullerton, at the Titan Gym.

The Rebels jumped out to an 11-2 run after the half and extended their lead to 20, at 57-37. Larry Johnson scored six of the 11 points during the run. Then, as usual, the Rebels began to substitute and it was all over.

The Titans jumped out to as the Rebels played incon-

sistently early in the first half. The Rebels took their first lead at 7-6 when George Acklesslammed down a dunk. The Rebels then ran to a 23-14 lead midway through the first half, after Larry Johnson scored and was fouled. The Rebels were unable to break away as they usually do, but did go on a 7-0 run to give themselves a 43-30 lead. The Rebels largest lead was 14 points at 46-32, just minutes before the half.



On Thursday night the Lady Rebels struggled past the Fresno State Bulldogs, 72-69, in a game that UNLV had trailed most of the way. It appeared that neither team wanted the victory as there were 56 turnovers and 30 personal fouls committed by the two teams. The performances of center Tasha Bradley, 11 points and 14 rebounds, and guard Vicki Lander, with a team-high 16 points, rallied the Lady Rebels for the win. The Lady Rebels finished the regular season with a sixgame winning streak and a record of 24-5 (15-3 conference record). They enter the Big West Tournament as the top seed even though they are tied with Long Beach State for first place in the conference. If UNLV does well at the conference tournament they might get a first-round bye in the NCAA Tournament. If that should happen, and UNLV wins its second-round game, they would then be the host team for the West Regionals that will be played at the Thomas & Mack Center on March 21 and 23.
