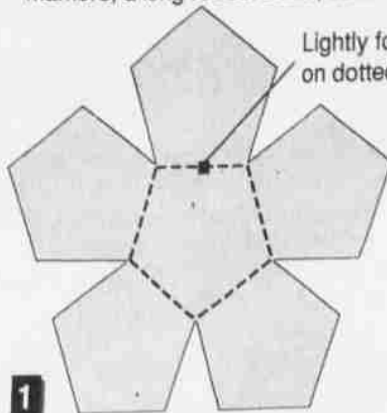


Try this: Jumping monster

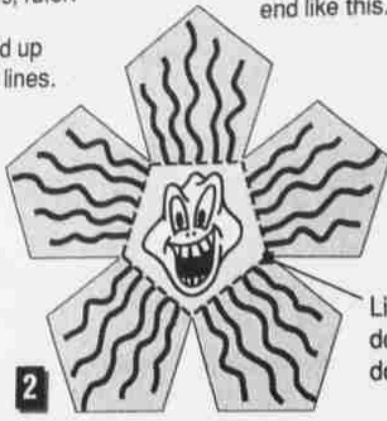
This experiment demonstrates that stretched elastic substances store energy that pulls them back to their original shape.

Make a monster that jumps

You'll need: Thin cardboard, colored pencils or markers, a long rubber band, scissors, ruler.

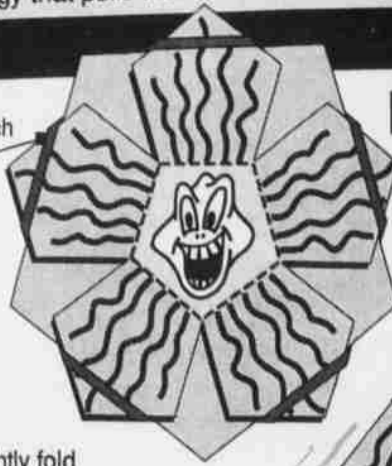


1 Draw a five-sided shape like this onto the thin cardboard. Cut out the shape.



2 Make another one exactly the same and decorate it with patterns or a monster face.

Loop rubber band over each end like this.



3 Overlap the two shapes and loop the rubber band over every other corner to hold the two halves of your monster together. Make sure the rubber is slightly stretched but not too tight.

Lightly fold down on dotted lines.

4 When you let go of the monster it will jump up into a solid shape.



Why did it happen?

Some substances, such as elastic or rubber, stretch when you pull them but spring back to their original shape and size when you let them go. The energy in the stretched rubber band pulls the cardboard into the monster shape.

Revenue: \$9,765,000

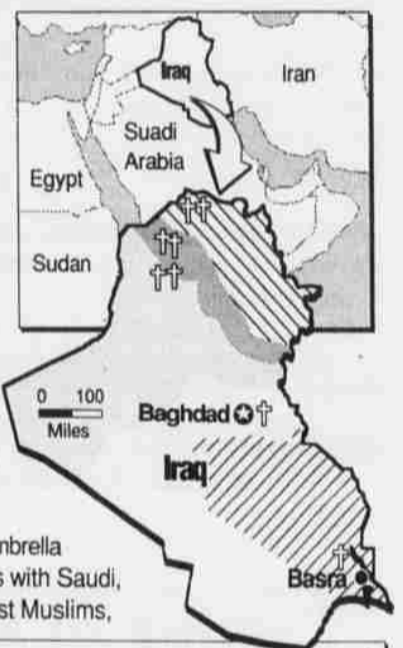

Iraq's defeat in the Gulf War will bring a power struggle among these factions:

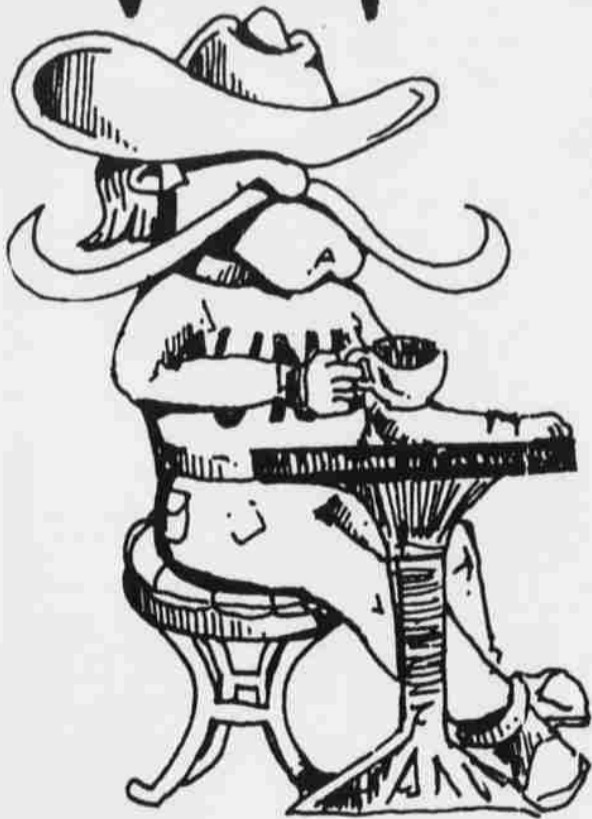
- **Baathist Party**, ruling party of Saddam Hussein; secular in outlook; most members are Sunni Muslim Arabs
- **Islamic Revolutionary Party of Iraq**, headed by Mohammed Bakr Hakim, in exile in Iran; members are Shiite Muslim
- **Iraqi Kurdistan Front**, headed by Hoshiyar Zebari; members are mostly Sunni Muslim Kurds
- **Iraqi Salvation Movement**, an umbrella group formed by opposition leaders with Saudi, Syrian help; includes fundamentalist Muslims, Kurds, pro-Syrian Baathists, Communists

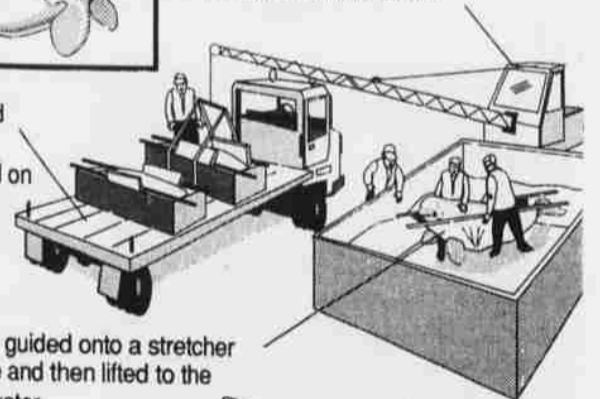

Beluga whales being flown to Midwest

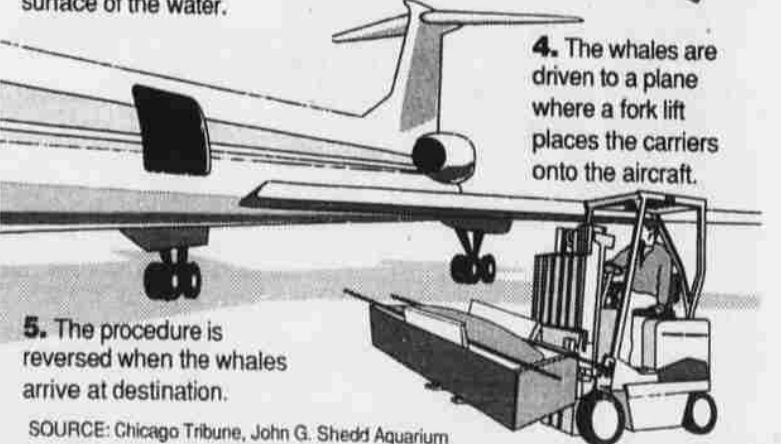
Two beluga whales were flown March 5th from Tacoma, Wash., to Chicago's Shedd Aquarium by chartered plane. How a whale is moved:



1. Carriers lined with layers of foam are placed on a flat-bed truck.



2. The whale is guided onto a stretcher lined with fleece and then lifted to the surface of the water.



4. The whales are driven to a plane where a fork lift places the carriers onto the aircraft.

5. The procedure is reversed when the whales arrive at destination.
