

# Bob Hall lectures at UNLV

"Just 'cause we're dating don't mean we're mating."

"Just because we're dating don't mean we're mating." Bob Hall wears a sweatshirt with that saying every time he lectures at a college about sex and dating.

"If we know what's OK sexually, and know what we want in a relationship, why won't we talk about it?"

Hall explained that we avoid talking about sex to avoid conflicts in the relationship.

Conflict and lack of communication in the relationship lead to problems like misunderstandings, unwanted sexual aggression, and date rape.

Hall lectured at UNLV Wednesday, March 20. He tours through his company, Learning To Live With Conflict. Hall has been lecturing about self-defense and the conflicts posed by sex and dating for the last four years.

Hall did not stand behind a podium, but came down to the floor to interact with the audience. There was a couch up on the stage "for demonstrations," he laughed.

Two people in the audience were asked to stand and Hall announced, "This is a man. This is a woman. When it comes to dating, that's really all we can assume."

Several times Hall mentioned his slogan "Hands Off-Let's Talk." He stressed the importance of talking to dates to avoid "the Cold War."

"The Cold War," according to Hall, is the point in a relationship when the two people involved recognize a difference or conflict between each other's understanding of the relationship. "That's when we have to talk," said Hall.

Hall recognizes that the communication problem between men and women has developed because of the way children were socialized.

"Teen magazines sell girl's stuff to make them more attractive to boys, but on the next page they can get advice on how to say no to sex," observed Hall. "This is programming schizophrenia!"

Boys are taught to "focus on age of who rape really involves."

According to American stereotype, people expect rapists to be lurking in dark alleys, and the victims to be loose women who "deserved it."

"But that's not accurate," Hall said, "Expectations of who rape victims and rapists should be made it easy to move the problem away from us and ignore it."

"One in three women will be a victim of sexual assault during her lifetime," said Hall. "While one in four women will be a victim of sexual assault by someone they know."

"If there is one thing that will make us talk about sex," Hall predicted, "it'll be AIDS. If you are engaging in sexual activity without condoms, you are insane."

Hall ended by reminding the audience, "everything has to do with choices. Make your own choices because you have to live with the consequences."

Hall is concerned that college students especially, but people everywhere, have the wrong im-

first half and converted only once. Duke was six of six; junior center Christian Laettner was five of five himself.

Laettner caused UNLV fits in the first half. He scored 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting and Ackles picked up three fouls. The Rebels made adjustments on defense in the second half but other Duke players picked up the slack. Laettner led the Blue Devils with 28 points and seven rebounds.

"We're a different team this year," Laettner said. "We felt pretty good about our defensive end of the game; we did a good job on Johnson."

Johnson, UNLV's consensus All-American, finished his two-year Rebel career with 13 points and 13 rebounds. He hit five of 10 shots, shooting below his 67 percent season average. He and Stacey Augmon combined for only eight of 20 shots and 19 points.

Hunt led UNLV with 29 points (the same number he scored last year against Duke) but missed

seven of his 11 three-point attempts. Anthony had 19 points and six assists.

The Runnin' Rebels finish the season 34-1. They fail to become the first undefeated champion since Indiana in 1976. It was the final college game for Larry Johnson, Stacey Augmon, Greg Anthony, George Ackles, David Rice and Chris Jeter.
