

## Conclusion of the Jewish Community Lecture Series

Professor Steven L. Spiegel is the fourth and concluding speaker in the Annual Jewish Community Lecture Series of Las Vegas, Sunday April 28 at 7:30 p.m. Community-involved individuals, organizations and the five congregations sponsor the lecture for the general public. Congregation Ner Tamid is this year's facility host.

Spiegel is a professor of political science at UCLA and author of *The Other Arab-Israeli Conflict: Making America's Middle East Policy, from Truman to Reagan* which won the 1986 National Jewish Book Award. His Las Vegas subject will be "America's Mideast Policy, from Truman to Bush," adding the Bush administration's policy to those described in his acclaimed book.

Spiegel states that U.S. policy toward the Middle East is peculiarly affected by the influence of particular presidents. He will explore the attitudes and approaches of the individuals at the top of the U.S. government who have made the United State's

policy toward the Arabs and the Israelis. He will show the differences and similarities between them, particularly emphasizing special traits about each president; and there will be particular emphasis on the current administration and where America-Middle East policy is heading.

Spiegel's articles have appeared in many magazines, journals and major newspapers and he has authored and edited five additional volumes on international politics and foreign policy. He is frequently interviewed on radio and television to discuss current world events, and invited to lecture at national and international conferences, to community and civic groups, and on university campuses.

Spiegel has twice been named by UCLA's political science honors students as the "best teacher" of the year and in early 1985 a student survey named him one of the four "more recommended" teachers on the campus at the upper-division level.

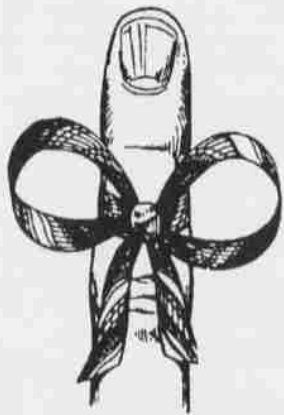
## Condom maker warns student to back off

TUCSON, Ariz. (CPS)—The manufacturer of Trojan and Hercules condoms has warned a University of Arizona student to stop selling a condom-shaped computer dust cover—advertised as helping to "protect against viruses"—or risk a lawsuit for violating trademarks owned by CarterWallace, Inc. of New York.

In a letter to UA student Nyles Bauer, the company threatened to

sue if Bauer did stop selling the product, which caused "consumer confusion as to the source or origin of the product." The project, Bauer told the Daily Wildcat, the campus paper, involved about 1,500 special "reservoir-tipped computer covers that are a two-foot take-off on condom packages."

He said he plans to stop selling them as soon as he empties his inventory.
