'Rust in the Dust' car rally

On your mark, get set, go! The women of Zeta Tau Alpha sorority are sponsoring a car rally Saturday, April 27 from noon to 5 p.m. in the Artemus Ham Hall parking lot on the corner of Maryland Parkway and Cottage Grove. The rally will benefit United Cerebral Palsy of Las Vegas.

The object of the car rally is to drive to five different check spots within Las Vegas. Each car will be given a Tupperware bowl with a foam cup of water inside. The inner cup will not be sealed, but the bowl will. Once participants reach each spot and give the secret word, they will be given a sticker for their bowl.

Whoever reaches the finish in the least amount of time, spilling

the least amount of water, is the winner.

Participants will register the day of the rally and the driver of the car will pay \$15, receiving a free T-shirt and ticket for the party after the rally. Other members of the participant's team must pay separately for T-shirts and tickets.

Holly Chamberlain, philanthropy representative for ZTA, organized the car rally along with United Cerebral Palsy and is hoping for a turnout of 75 to 100 cars to participate.

"The women of ZTA are excited and hope to raise \$2,000 and encourage everyone at UNLV to get involved," Chamberlain said.

No one knows the finish point until the final checkstand and

prizes will be provided for winners. Participants are also given a "panic envelope" to ensure that they follow the rules and the speed limit in the rally. If the participants become lost they can open up the envelope and find where the finish of the rally is located. Also if they are pulled over by a police officer they must open up their envelope to retrieve their driver's license. Opening the envelope will result in disqualification from the race.

First place prize is a \$200 tour of the Grand Canyon provided by Air Nevada Tours; second prize is dinner for two at the Four Queens; other prizes will be provided by Ted Weins, Mr. Magic Mobile Car Wash, Burger King and many others.
