Veracruz company re-creates Mexican dances


The popular Ballet Folklorico "Quetzalli" de Veracruz will come to the Artemus Ham Concert Hall May 14 at 7:30 p.m. for a performance of authentic folk dances from different regions of Mexico. The group will perform music and dances from five different states of Mexico, including their native Veracruz.

The company of nearly 20 represents the finest in music and dance from the culturally rich area of Veracruz. It is supported by the Department of Tourism and Economic Development for the state of Veracruz.

Some of the dances that will be performed include "jarabe nayarita," which uses machetes of the region and also the well-known dances of Jalisco, which are associated with the music of the mariachi. From Veracruz will be the "sones jarochos," which feature experts in the folk harp, the jarana, requinto and others. The music is from the region of Sotavento, home of the jarochos. The most wellknown piece from this area is "La Bamba."
