The Student Health Center Is NOT Advocating Mandatory Health Insurance!

Contrary to an earlier report, the UNLV Student Health Center is not trying to pass mandatory student insurance. The health center has nothing to do with insurance, or with the university's current insurance carrier, Humana. (Humana provides completely voluntary insurance for off-campus health services only.)

The Student Health Center is asking students to vote, on October 2 and 3, in favor of a student health

fee of \$20.00 per semester. This fee, if enacted, would significantly reduce the wait the students currently have at the health center by increasing the number of exam rooms and health care providers at the health center.

Note that the Student Health Center provides free examinations and low-cost medications for all UNLV students, regardless of full- or part-time status and for both graduate and undergraduate students.

There is also a question on the ballot concerning the Student Health Fee. Your vote will greatly influence the final decision made by the Board of Regents.
