

Nobel Peace Prize nominee to speak at UNLV

Nobel Peace Prize nominee Helen Caldicott will speak at UNLV's Artemus Ham Concert Hall at 7:30 p.m. Oct. 14. Her lecture, focusing on peace and environmental issues, is free and open to the public.

Caldicott is one of the foremost spokespersons for nuclear disarmament, saving the environment, and Americans taking responsibility for their government.

"Tonight, I am going to talk about how to turn this country into a democracy," declares Dr. Caldicott in a typical speech.

Caldicott is the author of *Missile Envy* and *Nuclear Madness* and is currently at work on her third work, *If You Love This Planet*.

She has been honored with the Gandhi Peace Prize and the University Women

Peace Prize for her leadership with International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War. She is founder of Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament and International Physicians for Saving the Environment.

While her lecture is free, tickets are required and may be picked up at the Ham Hall box office.

Co-sponsors of the lecture include KUNV, (the campus radiostation, as part of its 10th anniversary celebration) UNLV's Student Government, the Women's Studies Program at UNLV, University Student Health Center, American Peace Test, Citizen Alert, and Nevada Desert Experience.

develop science and engineering manpower in energy-related research.

"The recent events in the Gulf have shown us just how vital energy research and management are," Nevada Congressman Barbara Vucanovich said in announcing the grant "I applaud the efforts of both the DOE and UNLV to further developments in this crucial field."

Eighteen planning grants and eight traineeship grants will be made under the Department's Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research. This program is modeled on a similar program started at the National Science foun-

datation.

The planning grants will be used to prepare comprehensive five-year state plans for strengthening energy research and improving each state's human resource base for science, mathematics and engineering.

Traineeship appointments will focus on objectives to increase the number and quality of graduates with advanced training in energy-related disciplines and to provide masters and doctoral-level research experience through participation in ongoing university energy research programs.
