Cougars embarrass Rebels, 40-13

WSU kicker Hanson boots NCAA-record 62-yard field goal

The Rebel football squad, coming off a one-point victory over New Mexico last Saturday, was looking to extend its winning streak to three games.

The Rebels scored first on a Derek Black 4-yard run taking a 7-0 lead with eight minutes left in the first half. Scoring first was not a plus in this instance because Washington State struck back quickly, scoring two touchdowns in the last four minutes of the half.

The Rebels had controlled the flow of the game through the first quarter and a half. When the Cougars brought 6-foot-5 sophomore quarterback Drew Bledsoe

into the game in the second quarter, he responded by leading WSU on two touchdown drives.

These two touchdowns marked the beginning of the end for the Rebels. The Cougars scored first in the second half and their defense suffocated UNLV. The Rebels scored their only second half points on a 47-yard run by freshman running back Henry Bailey in the third quarter. Freshman kicker Nick Garritano missed the extra point making it 21-13 Cougars.

The Cougar defense held the Rebels to 151 yards rushing on 48 carries and 99 yards passing. Washington State's offense picked apart the Rebel defense for 172

yards rushing on 45 carries and 277 yards passing.

Washington State controlled the second half, extending their lead to 28-13 by the end of the third quarter, and adding 12 more points in the fourth.

The highlight of the game came when the Cougars' much-heralded All-America kicker Jason Hanson kicked a 62-yard field goal, setting an NCAA record. The NCAA dropped the old records when teams ceased using a tee for field goals in 1989.

The Rebels will look to get back on the winning track as they host Long Beach State at 7 p.m. on Saturday. The game will be the Rebels' Homecoming.

UCLA (6-2) dominated the contest. Paul Ratcliffe scored the Bruins' first goal 12 minutes and 28 seconds into the contest. The Bruins leading scorer Joe-Max Moore score the final goal at 63:23.

The Rebels only score of the game came from Daniel Packer with 15 minutes left

in the contest. The goal was the first of the season for Packer.

The Rebels were also held to one goal playing at Cal State Fullerton on Sunday. The lone goal came from senior Terry Pryer. The goal was Pryer's third of the season. Both Titan goals came from the foot of Ken Hesse. The Titans have

beaten the Rebels by the same 2-1 score at Fullerton in each of their last six meetings.

The Rebels will be back home hosting the UNLV Coors Light Soccer Classic this weekend. The Rebels will play UC Irvine on Friday and UC Santa Barbara on Saturday. Both games begin at 7 p.m.

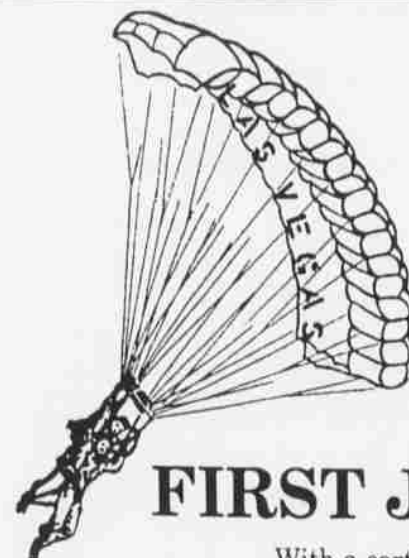
The sophomore was an all-conference selection in doubles last year as well as a 20-match winner and is ex-
