Museum director to speak

Michael Schantz, director of Philadelphia's Woodmere Museum, will speak at 7:30 p.m. Oct. 3 as part of the Southwest Gas Distinguished Artists Series. Schantz's lecture, to take place in the Hendrix Education Auditorium, is titled "Collections Development in Museum Settings." The lecture is free to the public.

Robert Tracy, chairman of the art department, said Schantz's appearance in Las Vegas is timely because museums nationwide are at a crossroads and the next few years will be critical in determining their future.

"Las Vegas itself is at a critical juncture in terms of galleries and museums," Tracy said, noting that several private galleries have opened in Southern Nevada in recent years because of

the tremendous growth in population.

Tracy said Schantz will address one of the major problems facing museums throughout America today — the severe shortage of funding for the arts.
