The Rebels' first goal came in the first 10 minutes of play by Thies Carstens, assisted by Terry Pryer. Just 10 minutes later, the Rebels scored again with a penalty kick by Daniel Barber. San Jose State then countered for another penalty shot to be taken by Troy Adamitis, against Rebel

The Rebels clearly dominated the entire game, but didn't score again until near the end of the game. Mike Madrid took a corner kick in the 74th minute setting up Thies Carstens' second goal of the game. With five minutes remaining in the game, Daniel Packer failed his first attempt of a one-on-one, he then recovered to score a one-on-one against keeper Ed Bedinotti to end the victory.

Smash of the Titans: Rebels cruise past CS Fullerton 25-3

Saturday at Eddie West Stadium in Santa Ana, Calif., the Rebels took advantage of the warm weather and handed the Cal State Fullerton Titans a 25-3 beating.

The game started off in true Rebel fashion as the Titans scored first only 2:55 into the game on a 52-yard field goal by Phil Nevin.

The Rebels drove and set up a 40-yard field goal that Nick Garritano missed. Down 3-0 the Rebels drove closer on their next possession and set up a 24-yard field goal which Garritano also missed.

In the second quarter the Rebels drove 71 yards on 10 plays for their first score of the game. The 1-yard run by Derek Black was set up by a 23-yard pass from Derek Stott to John Ma'ae and a 16-yard scramble by Stott. Garritano's extra-point attempt failed but the Rebels led 6-3.

CSUF blocked a Brian Parvin punt and it was recovered by Davis Watson at the UNLV 43-yard line. The Rebel defense was selfish and didn't let the Titans capitalize.

With 2:08 left in the half, Stott hit Henry Bailey on a 52-yard touchdown pass. Parvin came in replacing Garritano to kick the extra point. Parvin's second attempt came after a delay of game penalty and he also
