at midfield. Derek Black rushed for 128 yards on 25 attempts.

The Rebels final score came on a 41-yard field goal by Garritano.

The Rebels rushed for 220 yards and passed for 209. Bailey ended the game with four receptions for 151 yards and rushed for 15 yards.

The Rebels have a week off, but will look to improve their record to 3-3 against Fresno State at Bulldog Stadium, Saturday, Oct. 26, at 7 p.m.

The Rebels weren't so lucky when they faced the Fresno State Bulldogs on Sunday. The Bulldogs were led by the nation's leading scorer, Gerrell Elliot (38 points on 15 goals, and 8 assists) and freshman goalie David Kramer, who leads the far west region with a 0.41 goal-against average.

Fresno left their mark at UNLV with their last visit when they captured the UNLV Ethel M. Chocolates Rebel classic tourney.

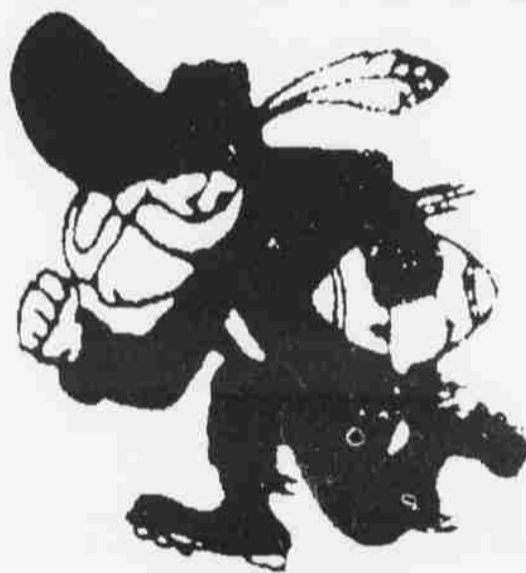
The Rebels fought relentlessly, but still lost in an overtime battle 2-1. it was a penalty-filled game; 22 minutes into the contest, referee Bob Singer threw his first yellow card on Ben Erickson, of the Rebels. Soon

to follow would be four more yellows, and one red card to eject Benjamin Callcott from the game.

The Rebels scored the first goal of the game at 28:20, when Terry Pryer beat two defenders to give a crossing pass to Thies Carstens which he headed in. Fresno State then tied it up in the 43rd minute with a 40-yard free kick by Richard Wright of Fresno State to tie the match 1-1.

With a tie score at the end of regular playing time, the game continued into overtime. During the overtime play, the Rebels lost their intensity and energy and sacrificed a goal in the first 10 minutes to Bulldog Tracy Day, for the final score of 2-1.
