Performing ensembles for the evening will include the Chaparral High School

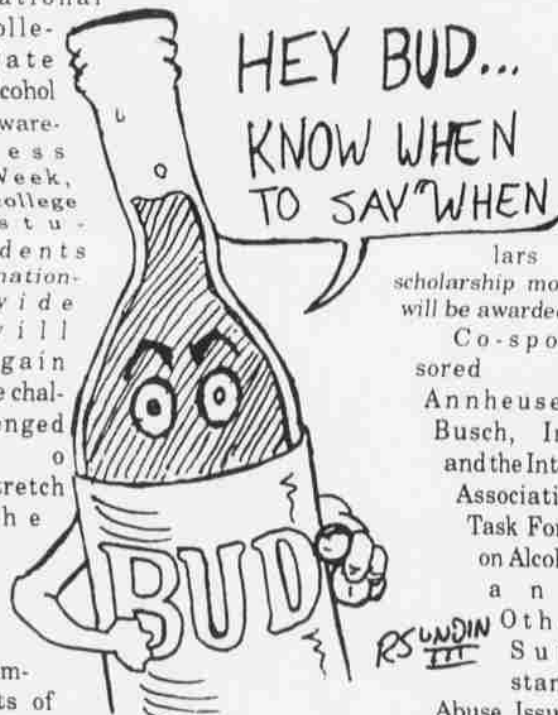

Poets participating in the reading will be Joan Cutuly, Bob Dodge, James Hazen, Billy Jean James, Steven Liu and A. Wilbur Stevens.

Other poets whose works appear in the book may also be present include Elizabeth Perry Peter Parsons, Bobbi Curry-Cartwright and Jean Boudreau.

Shaun Griffin, who edited the anthology and contributed a poem, will be moderator for the evening. A book-signing will follow the reading.

"The publishing of

"Desert Wood" is a significant event for the state," said Christopher Hudgins, chair of the English department. "It is the first time we've had a really serious anthology of Nevada poetry published. Also, it is the first time the University of Nevada Press has published a volume of verse." He added that "Desert Wood" may be the first in a series of verse books to be published by the university press.

Three of the poets who will be participating in the reading, Dodge, Hazen and Stevens, are professors at UNLV.

Liu teaches at the Community College of Southern Nevada and Cutuly is a teacher at Clark High School. James lives in the desert near Las Vegas and writes poetry.

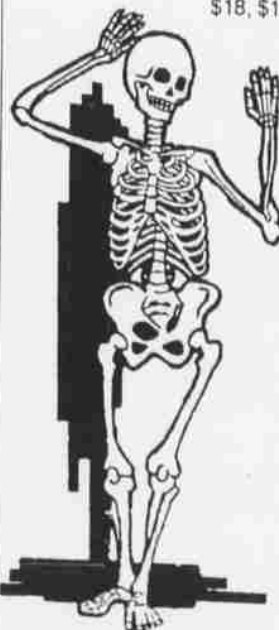
