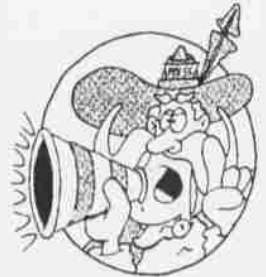
Is your child another Einstein?
