Mirage executive speaks at PRSSA meeting

Alan Feldman, vice president of public relations for the Mirage Resorts Inc., spoke to the students of the Public Relations Student Society of America (PRSSA) on Oct. 28.

Feldman told the group that the public relations boom of the 1980s is over. For the future, public relations will have to justify its existence to corporate America. The public relations field and jobs in it, will become increasingly competitive.

"News media experience is the most important thing I look for," Feldman said when ask what he considered the most important qualification for an entry-level position.
