Professor to speak on role of U.N. in Gulf War

"The United Nations and the Gulf War: Success or Failure?" will be the topic of associate professor Andrew Tuttle's lecture Wednesday.

Tuttle's talk will take place at 7:30 p.m. in Room 103 of Wright Hall. The speech, which is open to the public free of charge, is part of the University Forum lecture series.

Tuttle, an associate professor of political science at the university, will talk

about what the role of the United Nations actually was.

"The United Nations was virtually irrelevant," Tuttle said. "The United States was able to use the United Nations to manipulate other members to achieve its own policy objectives."

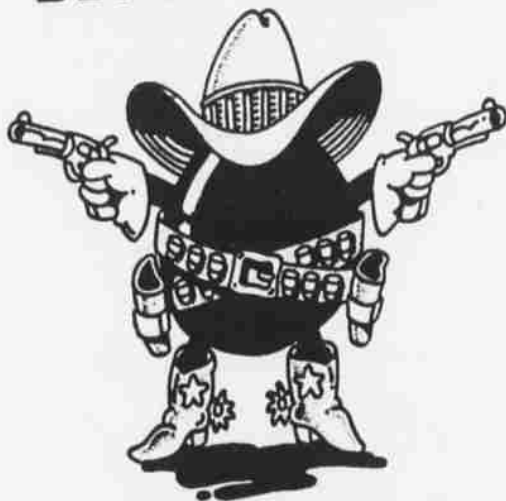
