In a meeting on Tuesday, UNLV's Faculty Senate mildly scolded its administration for the use of a secret

The senators approved unanimously a resolution which condemned the recent video tapings of a basketball conditioning class from an air conditioning vent in the North Gym.

Assistant Legal Counsel Brad Booke once again apologized for ordering the surveillance but emphasized he was trying to avoid an NCAA violation. Booke said he would continue to monitor the basketball program in other ways.

Booke assured the senate that he was not told by
