••Look for products packaged in materials that are readily recyclable such as cardboard, aluminum or glass.

••Don't buy products with excess packaging. Consider the alternative product with less packaging, even if it is only slightly less.

••Buy products in reusable containers or those that have concentrated refills such as Downey laundry detergent.

••Buy products that are made from the highest content possible of recycled paper, aluminum, glass, plastic and other such materials.

••Buy simple products containing the least amount of bleaches, dyes and fragrances such as Charmin Free toilet paper. Dyes and fragrances in toilet paper

make it harder to clean and filter the water supply.

••Look beyond products to the companies that make them and support those with good environmental records.

••Don't confuse "green" with "healthy" because not everything packaged in recyclable packaging is good for you or the environment.

••Don't be discouraged when there is no green alternative. There are very few green products, but those we do choose make a big difference.

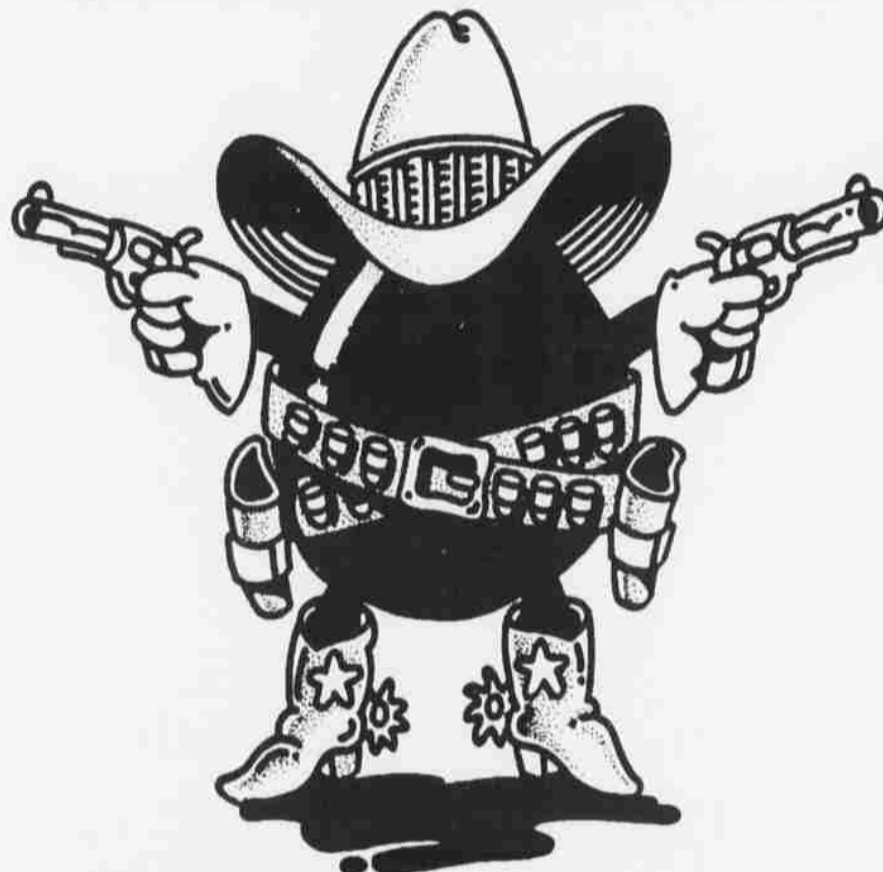
••Remember that doing something is better than doing nothing, and a small effort can add up to a big impact.

••It's fine to use paper or plastic bags to carry groceries home, but recycle whichever bag that is used.

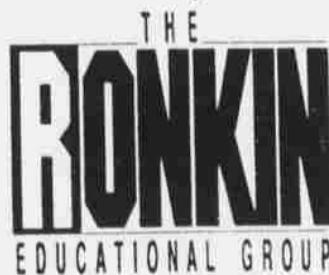
