Senate gives thumbs down to infamous taping

The Student Government Senate voted 11-0, Thursday in favor of a resolution condemning the controversial secret videotaping of an athletic class.

Senators, many of them new, were following the lead of the Faculty Senate, which voted Nov. 5, for a resolution opposing the October taping of an athletic conditioning course, authorized by UNLV legal counsel Brad Booke.

Booke apologized during a Nov. 1 press conference for authorizing the taping. He said he gave his okay to make sure no NCAA regulations against preseason play were being violated by instructor Tim Grgurich or the students, many of whom were basketball players.

Nevada Student Affairs Director Paul Stuhff,
