

Gresh advises students on broadcasting jobs

Brian Gresh, noon news anchor at Channel 8, told UNLV students recently that internships are a necessity to get into the news broadcasting business.

Six students from a TV production class toured the Channel 8 studios on October 26.

Gresh said, "If you're enthusiastic and willing to learn, many times an internship will lead to full-time employment with the same station."

He added, "You shouldn't wait until after you graduate to start looking for a job. You need to start now."

Gresh not only anchors the noon news, but is also a reporter. He says he doesn't prefer one job over the other, but that they compliment each other.

"I think I'm a better anchor because of my reporting and a better reporter because I anchor."

When asked the question, "Did you feel confident when you graduated?" by student Mary Ann Gutierrez, Gresh answered:

"No way! I was scared because broadcasting is such a wide field. I wasn't sure where I'd fit in or what I wanted to do. You won't feel confident either, but you just have to get out there and get the experience."

An annual scholarship award in the amount of \$1,000,000 is being offered to a college female undergraduate of junior or senior standing by the Sierra Nevada Region of Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc.

The title of the Scholarship is the Ceec Abrahams Memorial Scholarship. To qualify for application the applicant must meet the following criteria:

As stated above she must be of junior or senior status or will be completing her sophomore year by the end of the term in which the application is filed.

Her major (field of study) must be one that will qualify her for a career of service for the betterment of people, especially women.

She must be from the Sierra Nevada Region (includes all of

Nevada and in California—the area bordering Nevada to South Lake Tahoe, West through Sacramento to Winters, North up Sacramento Valley including Weaver-ville and Yreka then East to Nevada) but she may be attending a college/university anywhere in the world.

She must complete all criteria as requested on the application and the application must be post-marked no later than Feb. 28, 1990 to be eligible for this years judging. The application must be typed.
