Despite probation, Rebels still picked No. 1 in Big West

The name says it all, but does it? It must, because UNLV has been picked to win the Big West Conference by both the coaches and the media. Even though the Rebels lost all five starters from last years squad and have only two players, Evric Gray and Elmore Spencer, who saw any major amount of playing time last season, they are still considered the best team in the confer-

The Rebels received all but one vote by the 10 Big West coaches. The other school receiving the vote was Fresno State. The bulldogs were given the vote by none other than Jerry Tarkanian.

The media gave the Rebels 46 votes, New Mexico State one, Fresno State and Long Beach State received two votes

The main point of discussion surrounded junior J.R. Rider. The guardforward posses a 41-inch vertical leap and may be the answer to replacing Anderson Hunt in the starting lineup. Rider played last year at Antelope Valley Junior College where he averaged 36.5

With the absence of the Rebels, due to their being voted out of the conference tournament by Big West administrators, another team will have a chance to win the post-season conference tournament and an automatic birth into the NCAA tournament.

Strong gets birthday wish, 38-28 win over Aggies

The Rebel football team gave Coach Strong a birthday present as they handed the New Mexico State University Aggies a sound 38-28 beating Saturday afternoon.

With Hunkie Cooper starting at quarterback, Matt Wills back in the line-up and a few other freshmen starting, a Rebel squad that should have, been seen all year finally showed up.

This game was all UNLV. The Rebel defense, as usual, came on strong and stifled the Aggies' first drive of the game. The Aggies drove 50 yards in 7 plays and came up empty as junior Dan Amos missed a 31vard field goal wide to the right.

The Rebel offense on their second possession, drove 80 yards on 12 plays, capped off by Hunkie Cooper scoring on a 9-yard dash and the Rebels led 7-0.

After a 43-yard Brian Parvin punt, the Aggies went 74 yards on 10 plays and scored on an 11-yard pass from junior quarterback Charles Puleri to sophomore wide receiver Ezell Brown and the score was tied at 7-7.

Things looked good for the Rebels as Matt Wills went 37 yards on first down on the Rebels next possession. Two plays later Hunkie Cooper threw his first touchdown pass of the season to Henry Bailey for 31 yards and the score was 14-7.


The Aggies came back and tied it up on a 7-yard, 8-play drive toped off by a 35-yard pass from Puleri to junior wide receiver Fred Montgomery. The Aggies tied the score

The Rebels went into the locker room with a 21-14 lead after a 66-yard drive that took 13 plays. An unneccessary roughness call against the Aggies and a 13-yard gain by Matt Wills set up a 1-yard score by Shannon McLean.

The smallest crowd of the season, 4,771, was treated to what would prove to be the best offensive showing by this Rebel squad all season. The Rebels started the third quarter with a 73-yard scoring drive including a 12-yard scramble by Cooper and a 50-yard pass from Cooper to Bailey. A Matt Wills fumble was recovered by senior center Joe Biritz on the two yard line and parthefinal two rounds, sixthranked UNLV the drive was topped off by a 2-yard run placed fifth in the 18-team field at the Golf from Derek Black who scored his fifth World/Palmetto Dunes Collegiate at Hilton rushing touchdown of the season and the Rebels led 28-14.
