On Jan. 13, Steen told his students about news writing and editing, but ended his first lecture with anecdotes about

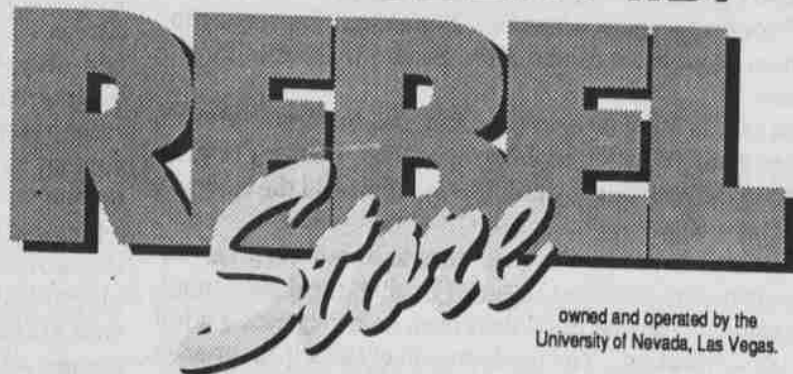
Beirut University College and his experiences while being held hostage for five years by Shiite Muslim extremists.
