Tonopah office will be moved to the first corridor.

"As the students enter the building next fall, it will very much look like a new building," Piper said in summation.

The Greek housing projects for the Alpha Tau Omega, Kappa Sigma and Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternities are estimated to cost \$3.6 million according to Jay De Leonard. After completion, monies owed for construction will be paid back

through rental fees. The housing areas will be run much like apartment complexes.

According to Leonard, each house will be designed with special features, including a color scheme that mirrors the fraternities. The houses' floor plans will be designed by a two-part collaboration between the fraternity and the architect.

The three chapters have to pay 75 percent of the architectural fee as a down payment.

This way, if one of the fraternities decides they don't want the house, it can still be built for another fraternity.

The Humanities building will cost approximately \$70,000. The remodeling of the communication studies department and the English department is possible through institutional funds. New office buildings for employees of these departments will be installed.

Berkley said Student Government's functions were a little different when she was in charge of it during 1971-72.

Student Government offic-

es were located on the third floor of the MSU, where KUNV is now. She said there was not a journalism department so Student Government published the newspaper. A Student Union Board was appointed by Student Government to somewhat oversee MSU activities.

"I think the students had a tremendous voice," she said.

After June 30, 1992, the spread may increase if program costs increase, but will not exceed 5.0%. Existing borrowers would be notified at least 30 days in advance. The loans may be prepaid at any time without penalty. For the month of October, 1991, the rate was 10.00%, with an annual percentage rate of 11.4625%.
