## Lady Rebs gear for Big West

The Lady Rebels travel to the Long Beach Arena for the 17th-annual Big West Tournament which runs Wednesday through Saturday. Third-seeded UNLV plays the No. 6-seeded New Mexico State at 9 p.m. Wednesday.

The Lady Rebels are 16-9 overall and 13-5 in the Big West. The New Mexico State

Roadrunners finished 15-14 overall, 9-9 in conference play.

UNLV has beaten the Roadrunners seven of the last 10 times the teams have played.

Earlier this season, the Lady Rebs defeated the Roadrunners 97-79 on Jan. 4 in Las Cruces, N.M. In that game, Merlelynn Lange scored a career-high 34 points.

However, on Feb. 13, the Roadrunners beat the Rebels 99-95 in overtime at the South

Gym. In this scoring explosion, Lange and Teresa Jackson scored 26 and 23 points respectively.

The Lady Rebels will look to avenge their loss to New Mexico State in the first round of last year's Big West tournament. In that game the Roadrunners' Tracey Goetsch canned a desperation three-pointer to edge UNLV 90-89 at the buzzer.


