## Do you vote, and what is your opinion of the U.S. Presidential candidates?



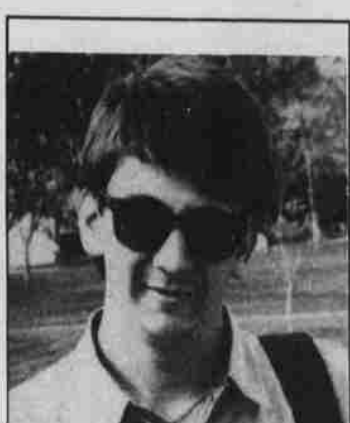
**Bryan Delugo, senior, communication**

**Martin Lee, freshman, accounting**

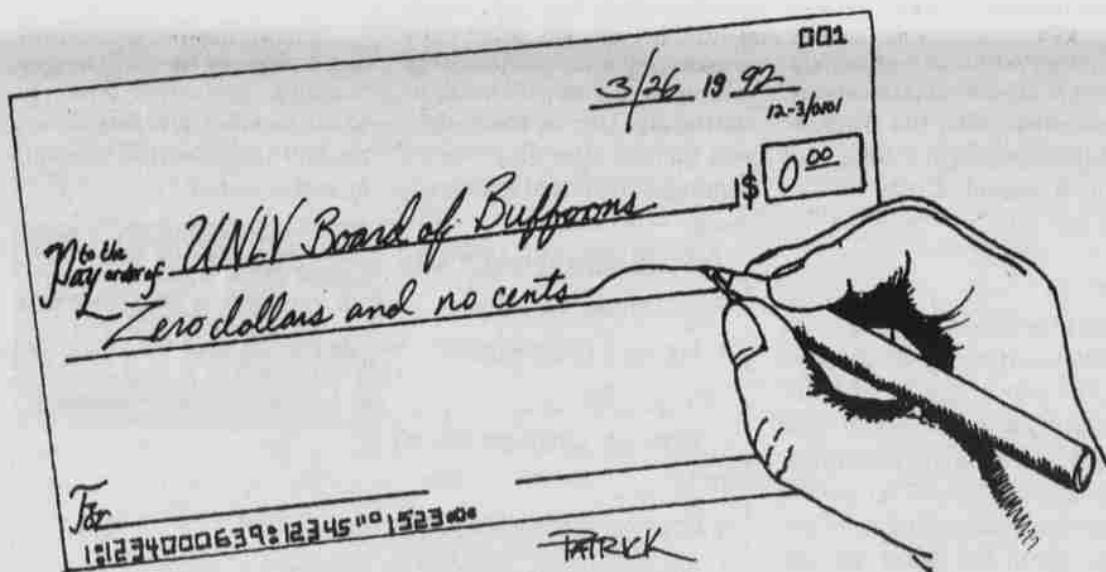
