Kostman also mentioned a number of activities Student Government is planning this fall including a review of the candidates running for the Board of Regents. A group of student leaders will interview candidates and discuss their qualifications. The group will meet on October 5 and plans to issue a recommendation soon after

Also on tap for this fall is the adoption of a student bill of rights. Kostman said it was worked on over the summer and is now being reviewed by legal counsel. If given the go-ahead, it will be sent to the Regents Counsel and, Kostman hopes, approved by the regents in November.

Student Government also plans to distribute a "safe map" of the campus showing the areas to avoid at night and a handbook for students that addresses the issues of sexual assault, harassment and discrimination.

Kostman plans to give his State of the Campus speech next Wednesday at the Student Senate meeting outlining where he stands in relation to his campaign prom-


