Boards & Committees

Students Government Boards and Committees are the administrative bodies that perform specific operative functions as delineated by the Student Government Constitution, By-Laws and Senate Directives. All Board and Committee members are approved by the Senate.

Committees are set up to handle temporary issues that require resolutions a timely manner. Examples of committees are the By-Laws Committee and the Constitutional Revision Committee. Complete lists of active committees can be obtained in the Student Government offices.

Boards are permanent entities set up by Student Government to administer on-going Student Government services and to achieve long-term goals. Listed below are the present Student Government Boards:

Nevada Student Affairs

The Nevada Student Affairs office acts as the students' voice concerning political issues of local, state, and national levels. In doing so, NSA attends biannual sessions of the Nevada State Legislature and informs Student Government of pertinent issues. This office holds the responsibility of being the chief advocate on issues of legislative or political matters concerning students.

Organizations Board

Student organizations are pertinent to the legitimization of campus life, activities and diversity. Chaired by the current Student Government Vice-President, the Organizations Board oversees the general welfare and security of Student Government recognized groups on campus. In addition, it provides annual funding to support activities of those groups. The Board may act as mediator in inter-organizational disputes and may also provide an informational base on which to heighten awareness and participation in Student Government activities.

Student Health Advisory Council (SHAC)

The purpose of SHAC is to promote quality health care as provided by the Student Health Center. In doing so, SHAC takes on a dual role of action as a communicator between the Health Center administration and the students and promoting health education to students.

Entertainment and Programming

The entertainment and programming Board appears to be the most exciting position in Student Government. However, this board has the challenge of cohesiveness, camaraderie, and school spirit among students through presentation of social, traditional, and educational activities. Such events planned each year are:

Elections Board

The Elections Board coordinates, arranges and oversees all student Government Elections. Candidates for Executive Offices, Senate and Homecoming all submit applications to this board and are instructed on the responsibilities and limitations of campaigning. The Elections Board must monitor all elections and ensure that fair and legitimate elections are conducted.

Office of Student Information

As with any organization or business, a good image is extremely important to develop and maintain. It is the responsibility of the Office of Student Information to report upon data that is conducive to the information of that image. In addition, OSI acts as a cheerleader for Student Government in that it helps create interest and increase participation in Student Government activities, issues, and elections.

Student Services

This department acts as a catch-all for Student Government services which are not large enough to warrant their own boards, yet are important to students nonetheless, are available free or at a minimal cost, and include:

- Free legal counsel
- A typing room
- Free blue books
- Roommate referral
- Lecture note service
- Free Scantrons
- Security shuttle

Appropriation Board

This board assists in preparing and submitting Student Government budgets to the Senate. During the year, the Appropriations Board makes recommendations on monetary matters and oversees funds to insure that budget goals are met.

What is Student Government?
Student Government provides students with many services including a typing room, free legal advice and free scantrons. Thereby associating the entire student body by enacting resolutions, implementing legislation, approving funding and acting as a liaison between the students and UNLV's administration and faculty. In addition, Student Government provides direct funding to recognized organizations as well as to other university entities, such as the student newspaper, the Rebel Yell and KUNV 91.5, the student radio station. Student Government strives to make college life more enjoyable for you by sponsoring many activities like debates, entertainment and seminars to increase both your academic and social awareness. Finally, Student Government itself can be a learning forum for you to develop political and leadership skills.
