## UNLV named 'best value' by studies center

UNLV has been voted one of the "101 Best Values in America's Colleges and Universities" by the Center for Studies in College Enrollment and Tuition Issues, of Bridgewater, Mass.

The center publishes a national newsletter for high school guidance counselors and a pub-

lication which profiles colleges and universities in America that they feel offer students high-quality academic programs and significant student-life experiences.

"UNLV was one of 16 new schools to be added to this year's list and I expect it to stay there for a very long time," said publication editor David Wilson. "The

school offers reasonable tuition rates, a very upbeat attitude on campus, and President (Robert) Maxson with his faculty is very dedicated to the school's academic excellence."

To be selected for the "best-values" list, a school first must be recognized by another publication. "UNLV has been ranked as an up and coming school in

the *U.S. News and World Report* for the past three years," Wilson said.

UNLV has become a national university with a national recognition according to Wilson. "When the incident between President Maxson and former Rebel Coach Jerry Tarkanian took place, the university received a lot of publicity in the

Boston area. "I felt President Maxson made a move of real courage by taking a stand and acknowledging loudly and clearly that academics was first on the agenda and sports second. That gave the university a great reputation in the East," Wilson said.
