

Rebels play role of spoilers vs. New Mexico

The Rebel soccer team (7-5-4, 3-3-0) will end a disappointing season when they play the New Mexico Lobos on Friday and the Cal. State San Bernardino Coyotes on Monday. Both games begin at 7 p.m. at Peter Johann Memorial Field.

Inconsistency and erratic play have caused headaches for Coach Barry Barto and his team all year. What began as a promising campaign with early wins

over Stanford and Air Force has ended in a nightmare. Cal. State Fullerton hammered the last nail in the coffin when they hu-

miliated the Rebels last Sunday 9-0. It was the worst loss in school history. The sad part is the Rebels were playoff-contenders up until last weekend. Now they'll have to be content playing the role of spoilers when the take on the surprise-team of the year: 20th-ranked New Mexico.

The Lobos (13-3-1, 5-1-0) are fighting for a berth in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation tournament, and a loss would knock them out of the race. They come to Vegas loaded with offen-

sive punch. Midfielders Edmundo Rodriguez (18 goals, two assists), Richard Farrer (nine goals, 12 assists), Joe Owen (nine goals, four assists) and Mike Starti (nine goals, one assist) will severely test the Rebel defense, which has allowed 15 goals in the last four games. The Rebels hold a 2-1-0 series lead with the Lobos.

The Coyotes of San Bernardino State were 1991 Division II tournament contenders, but are struggling this year with an 8-

9-1 overall record. Their top players are Rolando Uribe (eight goals, six assists) and goalie Brian McCully (0.86 goal-against average). The Rebels and Coyotes played to a 0-0 draw in their only meeting last year.

Monday's game will be the swan song for six Rebel seniors. All-America midfielder Danny Barber and All-America candidate Thies Carstens will bid farewell to the fans along with Scott Brody, Willis Ferenbaugh, Scott Uderitz and Clint Larsen.

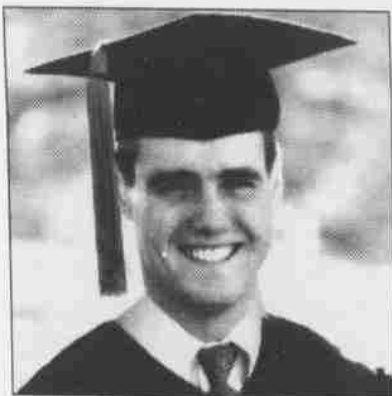
