The Coyotes of San Bernardino State were 1991 Division II tournament contenders, but are struggling this year with an 69-1 overall record. Their top players are Rolando Uribe (eight goals, six assists) and goalie Brian McCully (0.86 goalagainst average). The Rebels and Coyotes played to a 0-0 draw in their only meeting last year.

Monday's game will be the swan song for six Rebel seniors. All-America midfielder Danny Barber and All-America candidate Thies Carstens will bid farewell to the fans along with Scott Brody, Willis Ferenbaugh, Scott Uderitz and Clint Larsen.
