UNLV continued its shooting spree in the second half connecting 18 out of 35 field goal attempts and converting 14 out of 16 from the charity

"The team played really well. We're real happy," said UNLV head coach Jim Bolla.

Lighting up the boards of the Lady Rebels were Jackson, who scored 24 points and added five rebounds and Hopgood, who contributed 17 points.

The Lady Rebels shined on defense as well.

"I thought the kids did a real good job defensively just defending their (the Gauchos) offense," said Bolla

Junior guard Cherie Hogg led the defensive charge with a career-high eight steals against the mistake-prone, UC Santa Barbara assault. The Rebels ended the evening with 17 takeaways.

But early foul trouble doomed the Gauchos from the

get-go. With 10:49 remaining in the first half, UC Santa Barbara fouled the Lady Rebels seven times.

"(Becky) Brown got into foul trouble early and that kind of hurt them," said Bolla about the Gauchos' starting center who committed four faux pas in the opening period.

She and teammate Sasha Scardino eventually fouled out in the second half.

Also, Coach Bolla commended assistant coach Rick Glenn with getting the Lady Rebels ready against UC Santa Barbara.

Said Bolla: "This was Rick Glenn's game. He did a great job in scouting them (the Gauchos) and preparing the team for the game. The kids listened to him and executed very well."

The victory enabled UNLV to remain undefeated in the conference with eight victories. The Lady Rebels are 14-1 overall.

The Gauchos ended their five-game winning streak and are 9-8 overall and 7-2 in the Big West.

complete with street access, is included in the plans.

All this was made possible by a \$1.25 million grant, donated by the estate of Hazel Mae Wilson on behalf of her late husband Earl E. Wilson. The gift was part of \$6.6 million donated to the university, as announced on Nov. 23 of last year.

"To have 3,000 seats on our campus, I think is going to create an opportunity for us to eventually create a revenue-producing sport in baseball," Athletic Director Jim Weaver said. "The weather in this community is perfect for it and there is a natural interest.'

The stadium benefits more than the fans though. Weaver is optimistic about the income potential of the new park. Ticket sales and billboard advertisement could replenish the athletic department's overburdened coffers. Furthermore, hosting an NCAA Regional Tournament is now a possibility.

"In our experience at the University of Florida," Weaver said, "(Senior associate athletic director) Keith (Tribble) and I remember when we had a stadium that needed to be replaced and after that replacement we were able to generate revenues in excess of \$100,000 a year.

"That doesn't mean when you produce revenue it pays off all the expenses of the sport, but in
