

Swimmers add four wins to the season

With dual-meet season over, swimmers gear up for the conference championships.

The men's and women's swimming and diving teams successfully finished their dual-meet season in California this weekend.

The women's swim team took on Cal-State Northridge Friday and faced what they thought would be weak competition. Half

way through the meet the Rebels were behind by more than 10 points.

"We changed around the women's line-up, moved people to their strong events, and ended up winning by a pretty good margin," said Coach Jim Reitz.

The women swept the diving event and the 200-yard breaststroke and won the meet 127-116.

The men's meet was not such a battle. The Rebels won 12 of 13 events to beat Northridge 161-76.

The men faced stiffer competition however when the Rebels

swam against UC Irvine Saturday.

Senior Sal Castro ended his dual-meet career with a gutsy performance in the 200-yard butterfly. His time of 1:52.76 was seconds faster than he's ever gone in season.

The women won 11 out of 13 events to win the meet 135-98.

"This weekend was a satisfying end to a great season," Reitz said. "Now, we're just looking forward to the Big West Conference Championships."

The conference championships are in Long Beach, Calif., on Feb. 25-27.
