



Women's track wins MPSF indoor track championship

UNLV women's indoor track won the inaugural meet of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Women's Indoor Track and Field Championship held in Reno. The Sprintin' Lady Rebels easily outdistanced second place Cal State Northridge in the team standings on Saturday, 91-71, to claim the first-ever MPSF crown. Utah State rounded out the top three. UNLV dominated the 400-

meter, sweeping the top three places in the finals. All-American Crystal Irving broke her previous season-best time of 53.88, coming in first with a 53.28. Judy Fraser finished second with 54.69 and Michele Brown finished third with 55.50. Tarsha Handy came in at 57.28.

Jean Fletcher (2:12.02) and Latricia Dendy (2:14.40) took finished 1-2 in the 800-meter.

Swimmers finish second in **BWC** championships

UNLV's Mary Alice Torgerson was named Big West Co-Swimmer of the Year with Nevada's Natalia Pulido during the Big

West Conference Championships held in Long Beach, Calif. this past weekend.

Both Rebel swim teams came home with second place finishes in the tournament.

The men were runners-up to UC Santa Barbara, 263.5-217.5, while the Lady Rebels also finished behind their UCSB counterparts, 278-210.

Matt Westphal won the 200-IM championship for UNLV in 1:51.33.

Takuo Henmi came in first in the 1650-freestyle in 15:34.03, narrowly beating UCSB's Jason York by .13 of one second, UN-LV's Torben Scholer rounded out the top three in 16:08.07.

Doug Swan's 1:49.73 was good enough to win the 200-butterfly. Kristina Lutes started things off for the Lady Rebels by winning the 3-meter diving event with a score of 439.6.

The relay team of Aubrey Truett, Torgerson, Tara Clark, and Julie Mroziak won the 400-Medley Relay in 3:49.72.

UNLV swept the 200-backstroke with Julie Mroziak

(2:00.83), Mari Kasvio (2:02.82), and Truett (2:03.39).

Torgerson won the 200-breast by more than three seconds in 2:16.76. The time broke her own previous BWC mark.

UNLV's Jim Reitz was named Big West Men's Coach of the Year at the meet.

The Rebel swimmers will make a final effort to qualify for Nationals as they travel to the Arizona State Invitational this coming weekend.
