On the air with Maxson

President Robert Maxson told students his views about Coach Jerry Tarkanian's resignation, budget cuts and water conservation during "Minutes With Maxson" on KUNV 91.5.

Maxson was asked why he doesn't reconsider Tarkanian's resignation.

Maxson answered by saying the resignation Tarkanian submitted is legally binding and the matter is closed as far as the university is concerned. He said UNLV needs to set priorities.

"Will UNLV's priorities be academics, or will academics be

secondary to other priorities?" he asked. "I want to make it perfectly clear that I believe that there's no inherent conflict, no inherent tension between good academics and good athletics.

"I believe the best universities in the country do them well, but I must tell you, much of the discussion that's going on right now at UNLV on this matter is an academic discussion. Do we want this to be a serious academic institution? And that's the real issue."

Responding to a question about how budget cuts are going to effect student services, he said they are being protect-

ed as much as possible.

"Much of the budget cuts will come from building repairs and other types of repairs like that. So we're trying to look at those things that don't hit directly at students," he said.

He also said he is directing the budget cuts away from academics so that the quality of instruction at UNLV isn't hurt.

However, Maxson did say that many classes may not be offered next year.

"I think because of the budget cuts, we'll simply have fewer classes than we should offer and as a result we very likely could have less students next year," he said. "I think that UNLV will not experience the dramatic growth next year that we have had in the past because there simply won't be enough classes."

Maxson concluded the talk show by discussing water waste on campus.

"We've tried to do two things at UNLV. Number one, we've tried to make the systems that we have more efficient. Second, as we develop new areas we're trying to use more desert landscaping and combine that with more traditional landscaping," he said.

Maxson agreed that cutting down on the waste of water by suggesting watering less and using more efficient equipment. He also said that he will be looking into some recycling in that area.
