Although nearly 30,000 tickets for the upcoming Paul McCartney show have been sold, good seats are still available according to Pat Christenson, executive director of the Thomas & Mack Center.

Billed as the "New World Tour" McCartney's Sam Boyd Silver Bowl appearance will be the first of approximately 15 stops on the ex-Beatle's latest North American tour.

Tickets for the "New World Tour" are available at the T&M box office for \$32.50 and at all Ticketmaster outlets for \$37. Parking is included in the ticket price.

"The Silver Bowl will be the smallest stadium on the Mc-Cartney tour," Christenson said. "The set is actually designed for 70 to 120,000 people, so the screens are very large. That should mean everyone will be able to see."

Those concerned about the quality of seating should welcome this news.

The screens are part of a giant video wall that promoters say will show footage spanning Mc-Cartney's entire career as a member of The Beatles and solo artist. They are included as part of a massive set that will fill one entire end of the stadium.

Shows the size of the "New World Tour" seem to inevitably bring comparisons to last year's visits to the Silver Bowl by The Grateful Dead. Bob Barsotti of Bill Graham Presents is one of the McCartney tour's co-promoters and is also co-promoter for the Dead shows in Las Vegas. He said each group has a different

draw. "McCartney and The Dead are very different in terms of audience," Barsotti said. "McCartney's is a mainstream older crowd. They'll be wearing Polo's instead of tie-dyes."

Barsotti credits the Dead with bringing McCartney to Las Vegas. "McCartney's agent saw a picture of the sold-out Dead show backstage on the wall at the T&M," Barsotti said. "After that, he really wanted him (McCartney) to play the Silver Bowl."

shortfalls they would be made up from donations solicited from the recipients if the journal.

Another restriction was that Ace Denken would like the university to prepare and present an annual seminar on the state of gaming. Price said the problem is that Ace Denken wanted to control who attends the seminars.

"This is a direct violation against fiduciary policy," Price said. "It is our job as regents to uphold that policy, and by allowing a gift-bearer to dictate and control the attendance of a seminar is absurd."

According to Stutts, the contract would be rewritten to allow different people to attend and -it would not be a violation of the policy.

The regents have have tabled acceptance of the gift until April.
