

# Intramurals Corner

The UNLV Intramural softball regular season concluded Saturday and post-season tournaments for the three divisions will be held through Thursday.

Teams must have finished the seasons with a .500 record or better to advance to post-season play.

Additionally, teams with a forfeit loss — despite possessing a winning record — did not qualify for the post-season. Four teams — Zeta Tau Alpha (3-2) and Untouchables (3-2) from the Women's Division and Mynah Byrds (7-1) and At The Bar (4-4) of the Co-ed Division — grudgingly had their respective seasons cut short via this rule.

Only two teams, Sigma Kappa (4-1) and Alpha Gamma Delta (4-1), qualified for the Women's tournament. They will battle it out for the championship today at 3 p.m.

In the Co-ed Division, Nuts & Bolts (5-3) challenges Lions (5-3) in one semifinal while Cream Puffs (6-2) plays Max Vol (4-4) in the other semifinal. Both games are slated for today at 4 p.m.

Qualifiers from the Intra Fra-

ternity Council and Men's Divisions will compete in the same championship tournament. Lambda Chi Alpha (5-2), Sigma Phi Epsilon (6-1) and Alpha Tau Omega (6-1) are the IFC's post-season entries while the Sauce Workers (4-3), CBE (6-1), Hittin' Skynz (5-2) and the Jawaiians (6-1) qualified from the Men's Division. Quarterfinal games begin today at 3 p.m.

The UNLV Intramural four-on-four volleyball regular season came to a close last Thursday. All teams from all four divisions — Women, Men, IFC and Co-ed — will compete in divisional championship tournaments Thursday at the South Gym.

The Untouchables, 4-0 in regular season play, seized the first seed in the three-team Women's Division.

In the four-team IFC Division, Kappa Sigma (3-0) earned the No. 1 seed.

SPS finished 3-0 in the Men's Division to enter the one-day, post-season tourney as the top seed.

Feb 5 finished with a 3-0 mark and will be the No. 1 seed in an eight-team Co-ed Division field.

The IFC Division championship is slated for 9 p.m. on Thursday. The Women's and Men's Division title games will be played at 10 p.m. The Co-ed Division championship contest and the coveted Men's Campus Championship game are both scheduled for 11 p.m.

The UNLV Intramural one-day track meet was held at Myron Partridge Track April 17.

In the Men's Division, the Independents won the team title, beating out six other squads.

In the Women's Division, the Independents beat out ZTA and AGD for the team championship.

The Independent men won three of the 10 events. Darryl Glover won the 100 meter hurdles; the foursome of Glover, Al-Amin Muhammad, Stephen Willis and Kennedy Smith bagged the 4 x 100 relay, and they also salvaged the 4 x 200 meter relay with speedsters Muhammad, Willis, James and

Ricky Barlow.

Kappa Sigma also won three events despite finishing second in the overall team standings. Brent Nickerson won the 400-meter dash, Eric Thompson was victorious in the 1500-meter run and Morgan Rowley topped the pack in the 3200-meter (two mile) run.

ARA's Greg Holmes dominated the men's speed events, claiming the top prize in both the 100-meter and 200-meter dashes.

ATO's Larry DeCoursey was the shot put winner, and CSUN's Samuel Smith outdistanced everyone in the long jump.

In Women's Division competition, the Independents possessed the top-place finisher in six of nine events.

Catherine LaZarott, Cheryl Kosewicz, Mary Guinan and

Tracy Titus teamed up to secure the 4x100 relay victory.

Kosewicz, a versatile competitor, also claimed the top honor in the 110 meter hurdles as well as the 1500-meter run.

Guinan (shot put) and Titus (long jump) were double winners for the Independents.

Beverly Hatcher recorded the other first-place finish for the Independents in the 200-meter.

ZTA won three events — Melissa Bachorek (100-meter), Kristina Lopez (400-meter) and Angela Suarez, Danielle Ross, Kathy Link and Lopez (4 x 200 relay).

Producing hits wasn't the difficulty, it was turning the hits into runs that led to the stalemate. UNLV racked up 20 hits but stranded 17 runners. While the Lady Rebels landed a runner on third a couple times, a close call at the plate or a runner caught stealing would end up killing the scoring opportunity. Not a single gameable pitch off.

"It was kind of stuffy," McDonald said. "We couldn't ever get anything to happen. We couldn't get the calls on the close plays." As a result, Game 1 went nine innings before either team could score. The same UNLV betting

order that was dormant for eight innings suddenly put three hits and an error together to produce the game winning run.

With no outs, Sara Mallett drove in pinch runner Cyndi Hewitt, breaking the scoreless tie and handing Smith, the winning pitcher, her 18th victory in 20 decisions.

UNLV kept its hitting momentum just long enough to score

a run in the first inning of Game 2. Outfielder Steph Gonzales drove in lead-off hitter Tricia Reimche from third for the only run of the game.

Winning pitcher Amie Stewart (10-9) combined with Smith to tally 19 K's on the day.

UNLV improved its record to 29-11-1 overall, 19-4-1 in the Big West.
