Suzy Strazzulla and Melanie Van Thomme led AGD to the Women's team championship.

Strazzulla won the 100-meter freestyle and Van Thomme claimed the top honor in the 50meter backstroke. This duo joined Wendie Lappin and Andrea Hootein on the victorious 200-meter freestyle relay.

Two independents - Mary Hembree (50-meter free and 100meter back) and Karen Hourigan (50-meter breast and 100meter breast) - were double winners as well.

Four teams completed banner seasons in top-notch form last Thursday night as the championship round of the UNLV Intramural four-on-four volleyball tournament transpired at the South Gym to conclude the three-week campaign.

Kappa Sigma (6-0) won the coveted Men's Campus championship by sneaking past the Game Cocks (4-2).

Kappa Sig earned the right to compete for the campus title after defeating fraternity rival Tau Kappa Epsilon (3-2) in straight sets early that evening to win the Intra Fraternity Council championship.

The Game Cocks' road to the campus championship game wasn't as easy. The 'Cocks had to upset then undefeated SPS (4-1) in three sets to win the Men's Independent title.

In Co-ed action, the Underachievers (5-1) netted the championship by upsetting then-undefeated Fab 5 (5-1) in the finals.

The Untouchables (5-0) finished off a perfect season by defeating Touch of Class (3-3) in three sets for the third time this volleyball season.


