

Clemson hosts Rebels

Traveling to face a perennial football power for a season opener may not seem like sound advice. But that is exactly what the Rebels will be doing this weekend.

UNLV opens the 1993 campaign in South Carolina as it meets No. 23 Clemson.

The Tigers are coming off their first losing season in 16 years, going 5-6 overall and 3-5 in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Clemson is returning 44 lettermen, including 12 starters.

Conversely, the Rebels are coming off their first winning season since 1986 at 6-5 and return 46 letter winners, 16 starters.

Clemson's fourth-year head coach Ken Hatfield has posted a record of 24-10-1.

The meeting between the Rebels and Tigers will be the first ever between the teams.

Rebel Outlook

Survival may seem a more realistic goal for the Rebels. But don't let the predictions of gloom and doom fool you.

The true measure of a team depends on what kind of positives can be attained from such a challenge, what you can come away with from the learning experience. And that is exactly what the Rebel football team faces in Clemson.

Whether or not the Rebels get annihilated is not the big question. Playing a national power in front of more than 80,000 maniacs at Clemson's Death Valley will serve as a measuring stick for the rest of the year.

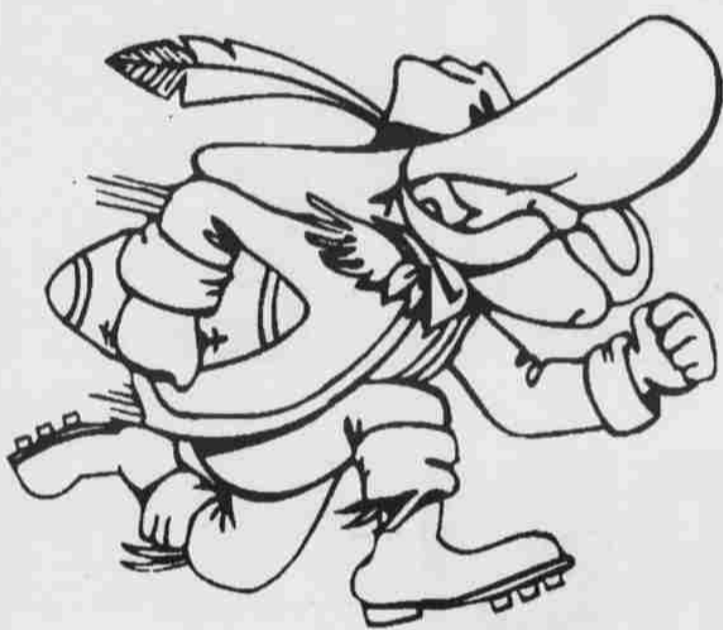
