

# Swingin' Rebels tie for second in New Mexico

The UNLV golf team finished in a second place tie with Arizona this past weekend at the William Tucker Invitational in Albuquerque, N.M. The Swingin' Rebels shot a three-round score of 858.

UNLV sophomore Chris Riley won the overall individual title, shooting a 3-under-par 69 Saturday to win his first collegiate tournament. He won the title by one stroke.

Riley birdied on holes 8-10 to finish 10-under-par 206 in three rounds.

Ed Fryatt tied for eighth place at 218. Chase Whitaker was 29th after shooting a 221.

Stanford won the tournament with a final score of 854.

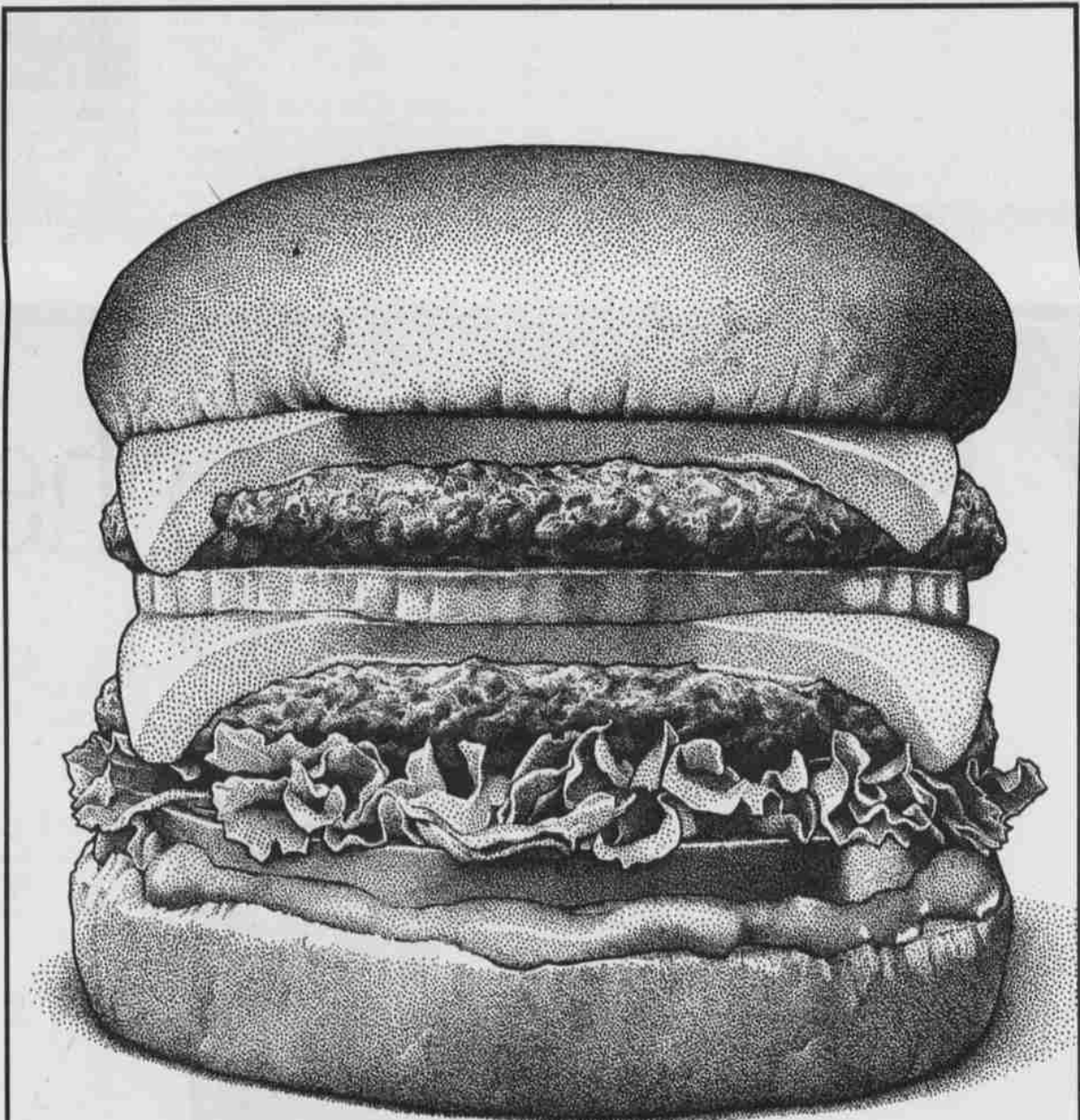
That's the Bo we want to know, not the one who might watch this year's Series from the bench in Comiskey Park.
