## **Rebels blasted by Air Force, 8-0**

With a 3-1 loss to George Mason and an 8-0 pounding by Air Force, the Rebel soccer team (2-6) finished fourth in a four-team tournament at the Air Force Academy Falcon Invitational last weekend.

Tourney host Air Force won their own tournament with a pair of shutout victories and George Mason finished second.

Two Rebels were named to the all-tournament team, senior midfielder Richie Louis and junior defender Artie Copeland. Louis is an All-America candidate and Copeland earned a spot in the starting lineup after an impressive performance coming off the bench against the Patriots of George Mason.


On Friday, UNLV played George Mason and lost 3-1.

The Patriots led 2-0 at intermission. UNLV came on strong in the second half, dominating the first 25 minutes as Bart Galia, a sophomore midfielder, brought the ball down the right side of the field and fed a cross to the penalty spot, where freshman PJ. Roberts tapped over to Tommy Miller. He laced it into the back of the net. But GMU put the nail in the coffin with a goal at 74:59 by Tamir Linhart.

Against Air Force, the Rebels again found themselves down 2-0 after the first half. The aggressive Falcons entered the second half in a complete scoring zone. The Cadets controlled the rest of the game from whistle to whistle netting six of nine shots for an 8-0 victory over the struggling Rebels.

The beating is the second worst in school history. UNLV lost at Cal State Fullerton a year ago, 9-0.

The Rebels will try to end their three game losing streak when they open Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Pacific Division play at New Mexico (5-3) on Friday at 7:30 p.m. UNLV will travel to the Albuquerque, N.M. campus as part of the UNM Craig Robertson Invitational. On Sunday, the Rebels will battle with Western Kentucky (3-5) at 11 a.m.


