Local boys Derrick Wells, Darran Wells, and Anthony Hudak have released a CD called Free Aspirin and Tender Sympathy- The Las Vegas Underground which features fifteen of Vegas' finest. Several bands floated in and out of the project, not truly believing that it (the CD) would really happen. The bands featured on FreeAspirin are"the bands who believed we were really going to

do it," says Derrick Wells. Someinterestingfactsabout the album: 1. The Scrubs song, "Farmer's Hankie" was recorded live in the studio. They didn't record track by track. 2. The album is dedicated to Wayne Coyner, owner of The Underground Record Store (which is why the album is called 'The Las Vegas Underground"). As Wells says, "Wayne has always been there for the local scene."3. Free Aspirin and Tender Sympathy is actually a sign at a gas stationonLas Vegas Blvd. Wells feels that it "represents Vegas."

The benefits were the most important part for making the album. "We had a really good response from the audience," says Wells. "The town really came through." It is also important to note that the bands did not pay to be on the album or get paid. All money raised went into the CD's production. No one is making money from this project!


