Crooks finished in a Lady Rebel-best time of 18 minutes, 18 seconds, good enough for 26th place in the 122-runner field. The time was a season best for the Central Oregon Community College transfer. It was also the fifth time in six meets this season that Crooks has scored UNLV's low time.



Gins said that UNLV seems to be on a roll and has really turned things around.


"Game by game we are getting better," he said. "As the con-


come together as a team. We are as good as we want to be. If we come toplay soccer, we can beatanyone." Gins, at 6-1, 190 pounds, is an
