The Rebel golf team finished in unfamiliar territory as they captured 10th place overall at the Jerry Pate National Collegiate Tourney in Birmingham, Ala.

The No.1 ranked Rebels finished the tourney with 884 total points. Wake Forest won the tournament with a total of 867
